#### GOVERNOR'S ECONOMIC RECOVERY ADVISORY BOARD RECOMMENDATIONS February 2021

- Increase short-term credit and non-credit training programs; online platforms, year around, students can begin any time.
- Develop an overall strategic plan that addresses the numerous issues that contribute to the child care barrier to work in Iowa. (Completed)
- Fund and scale successful nonprofit workforce training programs statewide, especially on-site training for adults facing multiple barriers to employment and aggravated by the pandemic. Provide wrap-around services for individuals while in training and transitioning to full-time employment.
- Expand work-based learning initiatives that forge schoolbusiness partnerships.

## ADDRESSING CHILD CARE

- Iowa has the most dual earner households in the country, thus child care is a necessity for employers and employees.
- Over the past five years, Iowa has lost 33% of its child care businesses and is short 350,000 slots for children younger than 12 years old.
- This crisis hurts more than lowa families. It also costs the state close to a billion dollars each year in lost tax revenue and employee absences.



## CHILD CARE TASK FORCE

Governor Appointed Task Force Recommendations are Forthcoming.

Four Main Areas to be Addressed:

- Regulatory Barriers & Financing Options
- Expanding Eligibility for Child Care Assistance
- Child Care Workforce Issues
- Increasing Employer Investment and Engagement Opportunities in Child Care



#### WORK-BASED LEARNING

- Work-based learning provides students with real-life, professional experiences allowing them to test drive careers and build skills for the workplace.
- The Governor's Economic Recovery Advisory Board recommended 75% of Iowa school districts will have one or more school-business partnerships by 2023, and all high school students will participate in work-based learning by 2024.
